

SOLICITOR:

Mr. Jones reported that no new discussions have been done with the Center Twp. Police Department for a new contract. There will not be any discussions until the Township knows what Shell Chemical Appalachia's decision is.

Mr. Jones is still waiting for information from Shell Chemical Appalachia, LLC for the Developer's Agreement between the two of us. Mr. Jones reaffirmed to Mr. Heitman that the process will be the same for this agreement as the first one. Mr. Heitman stated that the job is at a unique place in the construction process. He asked if an amendment to the original agreement could be done. Mr. Heitman also stated that as areas on the job site were at certain stages it was better to do work that will be needed to be completed for a later stage at this time. Mr. Jones restated that the Planning Commission must have forty five (45) days to review any new plan submission and if all work was on the Preliminary Plan, Dan Sell needs to review all of the amendments to the early stages. Ms. Matsco asked about road vacations to be done. Mr. Jones replied that he is preparing an Ordinance for the October Regular Business Meeting. We will not need to post signs throughout the Township as we did before as all of the roads involved are on Shell Chemical Appalachia, LLC's property.

Mr. Heitman also announced that Route 18 will be closed September 19 through 21. The road will be put back as it once was.

ENGINEER:

Widmer Engineering conducted an inspection of the Shell Chemical Appalachia, LLC construction site for an underground piping inspection last Tuesday.

Mr. Sell presented copies of the Act 537 Plan to the Supervisors. He wants to meet with them on September 23's Work Session to discuss before he forwards it to the PA DEP.

Mr. Sell and associates have studied the intersection of Mowry Road and Trillium Way. They are recommending a letter to verify that a three (3) way stop signs be erected. There was a discussion on whether the stop signs on Mowry at Bauer Road could be removed. The Supervisors will discuss this at the 23's Work Session. Mr. Jones stated an Ordinance would be needed to erect the new signs and it would be legal to accept the letter of recommendation from Widmer Engineering for the need of the signs. Officer Hall recommended flashing signs to make drivers more aware of these new stop signs.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Assistant Chief Jim Gabel reported the following to the Supervisors:

1. The Fire Department still has not heard anything concerning the \$95,000 FEMA grant.
2. Chad McMillen has not contacted the Fire Department about its 501c3 status. Mr. Jones stated Mr. McMillen is waiting for the Fire Department to contact him.
3. Training on water moving will be conducted on September 19 and 20.
4. He inquired when the wiring for the siren will be fixed. A truck from Russell Standard broke it several weeks ago.
5. Casey Harington reported there are still 12 seats available for the wine tasting tour on October 3. Please contact her reservations and details.
6. Casey also reported the Fire Department is holding a Thanksgiving raffle. They will be going door to door selling tickets.
7. The Fire Department is sponsoring a Soup and Bake Sale on Election Day here at the Municipal Building.

REAL ESTATE TAX COLLECTOR:

Christie Floyd-Gabel submitted the August Real Estate Tax Report to the Supervisors.

CITIZENS:

Peter Urtz stated his work schedule has changed and he will not be able to be at any Planning Commission meetings held on Thursdays. He will submit his resignation since he cannot attend these important meetings. The Supervisors replied that the meeting night could change to an evening he can attend. The Township will re-advertise the meetings.

Jim Gabel asked when the dip in Mowry Road caused by the installation of the drain pipe installation will be completed. The Supervisors stated Justin Cwynar will be doing the repair. Mr. Gabel asked why the Township is doing it and not the contractor who installed the piping. The Supervisors stated the Township will do the repair.

Mr. Heitman reported on the request for the guide rails along Pleasant Drive and Route 18. The rails along Pleasant Drive belong to PennDOT. He will ask them if they can be donated to the Township. The ones along Route 18's by pass belong to Trumble Constuction. He will ask them if they can be donated to the Township. If both can be donated, Shell will deliver them to the Township.
